BA American Studies Kernfach

For modules in your major American Studies, **please enroll via TOOL between March 22 (noon) and March 29 (5 pm)**. For parallel courses, choose early to get the seat you want. Once your registration procedure is finalized you are automatically enrolled for the respective module exam.

For your minor ("Wahlbereich"), browse the university's course listings and use the TOOL to select up to four (at least three) modules for the Wahlbereich and three for the "Schlüsselqualifikationsmodule" (Professional Skills Modules / SQM) for which you want to apply. The order of your list automatically serves as your priority list. Please check:

Starting March 30 (at noon), you will need to confirm your selection of Wahlbereich modules and/or your parallel slots online.

Below you will find more detailed information depending on your entering class cohort.

BA American Studies Wahlbereich / Wahlfach

If you study American Studies as your Wahlfach or Wahlbereich, you may select from the following modules: "Society, History, and Politics I" (SHP I); "Introduction to Linguistics for American Studies" (LS I); "Literature and Culture II" (LC II); "The Anglo-American World in a Global Context" (AAWGC); "Society, History, and Politics III" (SHP III); "Literature and Culture III" (LC III); and "Ethnicity and Diversity II – Multilingual and Multicultural America" (ED II – former LS III).

Please note that all of our modules require English language skills at level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference (i.e., at least 6 years of language instruction - "Grundkurs"). LC II, AAWGC, SHP III, LC III, and ED II also require completion of related introductory modules.

Select your modules via TOOL between March 22 and March 29. Starting March 30, at noon, you will need to confirm your registration and also select your parallel slots there (for modules offered in parallel slots).

We will offer remaining seats through the Restplatzbörse as of Monday, April 3.

MA American Studies

Please choose your modules **via TOOL between March 22, noon, and March 29, 5 pm**. Second-semester MA students may select from the following modules: "Political Cultures in a Transatlantic Context" (PCTC); "Media and Society in a Transatlantic Context" (MSTC); "Difference in Literature" (DL); "Inter-American Spaces and Latina/o Cultures"

(IASLC).

Fourth-semester MA students will write their MA Theses.

Lehramt Englisch

Students who take the module “Literatures and Cultures of the USA” (04-AME-1401) will attend the lecture and may select one of the four seminars.

Information for Individual BA Kernfach Cohorts

First-Year BA Students (Entering Class of 2016)

Second-semester BA students will attend the compulsory modules “Society, History, and Politics I” (SHP I) and “Introduction to Linguistics for American Studies” (LS I). You are guaranteed a seat in both modules, but you may have to compete for a seat in the parallel slots of your preference (SHP I and LS I seminars and tutorials). Seats in the parallel slots are limited and handed out on a first-come, first-served basis via TOOL.

Second-Year BA Students (Entering Class of 2015)

Fourth-semester BA students may attend “Literature and Culture II” (LC II) and/or “The Anglo-American World in a Global Context” (AAWGC). Parallel slots are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

If you choose to take one of these modules as Wahlbereich, please enroll via the TOOL's Wahlbereich section.

Third-Year BA Students (Entering Class of 2014)

Sixth-semester BA students may choose from the following modules: “Society, History, and Politics III” (SHP III); “Literature and Culture III” (LC III); and “Ethnicity and Diversity II – Multilingual and Multicultural America” (ED II). Also, in the sixth semester students ideally write their BA Theses.
