

# REGISTRATION INFORMATION SUMMER TERM 2013

## I. MAGISTER

Classes for Magister Hauptstudium are listed in our [course catalog](#), section "MA Courses." Please contact the respective instructor/s to find out if individual courses are open to Magister students and to learn about enrollment procedures.

## II. BA AMERICAN STUDIES MAJOR (Kernfach)

For modules in your major American Studies, please **enroll via [TOOL](#) between March 25, 9 am, and April 7, midnight**. Please note that you can change your selected module and parallel slots until the TOOL closes, but since students who take American Studies as their elective minor will sign up for individual slots as of Wednesday, April 3, it might be a good idea to decide early. Once your registration procedure is finalized, you are automatically enrolled for the respective module exam.

For further details please check below for the information pertaining to your specific BA year (Entering Class of 2012 etc).

### Enrollment For Your Core Modules (Kernfachmodule)

#### ***First-year BA Students (Entering Class of 2012):***

In the upcoming term, second-semester BA students will attend **Society, History, and Politics I (04-001-1002, SHP I)** and **Introduction to Linguistics for American Studies (04-001-1003, LS I)** as compulsory modules. You are guaranteed a place in these modules. In the Society, History, and Politics I module you may choose between three parallel sections offered for the module's seminars and tutorials (Übungen). In the Introduction to Linguistics module you may choose between two parallel sections offered for the module's seminars and tutorials (Übungen).

For enrollment in the modules you are asked to sign up via [TOOL](#) between **March 25, 9 am, and April 7, midnight**. Parallel slots are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### ***Second-year BA Students (Entering Class of 2011):***

Fourth-semester BA students may attend **Literature and Culture II (04-001-1007, LC II)** and/or **The Anglo-American World in a Global Context (04-001-1008, AAWGC)**. Please keep in mind that the Prüfungsordnung asks you to attend three out of the five core elective modules (Wahlpflichtmodule) offered during the program's second year. However, *you are free to attend all five core electives and use the extra modules to replace a Wahlbereichsmodul*. **In case you want to have one of these modules count toward your Wahlbereich, please use the [TOOL](#) (section BA American Studies Wahlbereich!) to apply for it!**

For enrollment in the modules as Kernfach modules, you are asked to enroll via [TOOL](#) between **March 25, 9 am, and April 7, midnight**. Parallel slots in the AAWGC module are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

### ***Third-year BA students (Entering Class of 2010):***

Depending on your academic “track” (SHP, LC, LS) and the requirements of your elective minor (Wahlbereich), sixth-semester BA students may choose one, two, or all of the following modules: **Society, History, and Politics III (04-001-1010, SHP III)**; **Literature and Culture III (04-001-1011, LC III)**; and/or **Language and Society – Language in Transition (04-001-1012, LS III)**. You are guaranteed a place in each of your selected modules.

For enrollment in the modules, you are asked to sign up via [TOOL](#) between **March 25, 9 am, and April 7, midnight**.

### **Enrollment For Your Elective Modules (Wahlbereichsmodule) and Professional Skills Modules (SQM)**

Students may apply for modules for their elective minor (Wahlbereich) and for the Professional Skills Modules (SQM) via [TOOL](#). As in previous semesters, you are asked to browse the [university's course listings](#) and select four modules for the Wahlbereich and three for the SQM for which you want to apply.

The order of your list automatically serves as your priority list.

Please submit your application for the Wahlbereich and the SQM online via [TOOL](#) **between March 27, 9 am, and April 3, 5 pm**.

A final round of late admissions (allgemeine Restplatzvergabe) will be conducted starting April 9. For details, please check the comments for each module in the [TOOL's Restplatzbörse](#).

### **III. AMERICAN STUDIES MINOR (Wahlfach)**

Students apply for modules for their Minor (Wahlfach) American Studies via [TOOL](#) **between March 25, 9 am, and April 7, midnight**. The following modules are open to Minor American Studies in the summer term 2013: **Society, History, and Politics I (04-001-1002)**; **Introduction to Linguistics for American Studies (04-001-1003)**; and **Literature and Culture II (04-001-1007)**.

Please note that all of our modules require English language skills at level B2 according to the Common European Framework (i.e., at least 6 years of language instruction). Literature and Culture II also requires completion of the Literature and Culture I module.

### **IV. AMERICAN STUDIES ELECTIVE MINOR (Wahlbereich):**

For the summer term 2013, the modules **Society, History, and Politics I (04-001-1002)**; **Introduction to Linguistics for American Studies (04-001-1003)**; **Literature and Culture II (04-001-1007)**; **The Anglo-American World in a Global Context (04-001-1008)**; **Society, History, and Politics III (04-001-1010)**; **Literature and Culture III (04-001-1011)**; and **Language and Society – Language in Transition (04-001-1012)** are open for students who take American Studies for their elective minor. Students need to apply for admission to these modules online via the [TOOL](#). It will be available **between March 27, 9 am, and April 3, 5 pm**.

Please note that all of our modules require English language skills at level B2 according to the Common European Framework (i.e., at least 6 years of language instruction). LC II, AAWGC, SHP III, LC III, and LS III also require completion of related introductory modules.

Please check the status of your requests for Wahlbereich modules at <https://sb.uni-leipzig.de/modulbelegung> after April 3.

**Important:** You are asked to **confirm your registration online. Please follow the TOOL instructions provided for each module.**

The presentation of a documentation of your English language skills (B2) for the SHP I module is required at the beginning of the first class. You cannot confirm your module spot without these documents!

Students who do not get admitted to any of the American Studies modules they applied for (**Härtefälle**) are encouraged to consult one of the advisors during regular office hours or attend the late admissions round beginning on **April 8**.

A final round of late admissions (allgemeine Restplatzvergabe) will be conducted starting **April 9**. For details, please check the comments for each module in the [Restplatzbörse](#).
